CAMP INFORMATION

A NOTE FROM THE COACH

Coach Lancaster has once again assembled a quality staff for the 2009 camp. The instructors selected to work at this camp have a wealth of baseball knowledge, good work ethics, and a genuine love for the game. The instructors here have experience from the high school ranks on up to the Major League level. It is the purpose of the Mount Olive College Baseball Camp to make sure that each camper has the opportunity to learn baseball fundamentals from the finest available instructors.

The Mount Olive College baseball program is considered one of the finest programs in the country. The Trojans have won thirteen conference championships in the last fourteen years, and advanced to the South Atlantic Regional's 7 of the last 11 years. The Trojans have also had a number of players sign professional contracts over this period.

It takes a lot of hard work and dedication to build such a tradition. This is a tradition that we have developed over the years and are very proud of. The 2008 season was a year where the Trojans obtained the ultimate goal of winning the National Championship.

Coach Lancaster is also very proud of the Mount Olive College Baseball Camp, which has also become known as one of the most respected in the nation.

Mount Olive College prides itself on offering its campers the hands on personal attention a student deserves. The only requirement is that the campers have a desire to learn, and a will to develop into the very best baseball player they can possibly be.

When you select a baseball camp for your son, you deserve the best. So why not become part of the Mount Olive College tradition in the summer of 2008.

This year we will be implementing the same camp structure as before. We will continue to divide the week of July 20-25, 2008 into two sessions.

COSTS: DAY STUDENTS COST: The cost of a day student is \$200, which includes all instruction, camp activities, T-Shirt, lunch, dinner and insurance.

OVERNIGHT STUDENTS COST: The cost for a boarding camper is \$250. This fee includes all instruction, activities, meals, room, T-Shirt, and insurance.

ARRIVAL AT MOUNT OLIVE COLLEGE: Upon arrival at Mount Olive College, all campers are requested to report to Grantham Residence Hall lobby for registration from 12:00 until 2:00pm on July 19th (session I) and July 22nd (session II). After registration the campers will have time to get situated in their rooms before heading to Kornegay Arena for the start of the camp at 2:30pm. If you are unable to arrive during this time, please call and notify the camp director before the registration date. If an emergency develops and you must leave camp early, you must check out with the Camp Director, Coach Lancaster.

July 19-21: Session I

This session is for campers ages 8 – 12, or those who will still be playing on 60 foot bases the next season. Registration will be held on Sunday July 19th from 12:00 until 2:00pm in the lobby of Grantham Hall. The camp will end with an All Star game at 3:00 pm followed by an Awards Ceremony in Kornegay Arena at 5:00 pm on July 21st.

July 22-24: Session II

This session is for campers ages 13 through 18, however, 12 year olds who will be playing on the 90 foot bases should attend this session. Registration will be held on Wednesday July 22nd from 12:00 until 2:00pm in the lobby of Grantham Hall. The camp will end with an All Star game at 3:00 pm followed an Awards Ceremony in Kornegay Arena at 5:00 pm on July 24th.

WHAT EQUIPMENT TO BRING: All campers need to bring a glove, cleats, tennis shoes, pants, shirts, and personal gear to play baseball. Shorts are okay for some sessions, but baseball pants will be needed for sliding sessions and games. Mount Olive College Baseball Camp will provide a camp T-shirt, baseballs, bats, and helmets. However, we recommend that catchers bring their own catchers gear. Bringing batting gloves is also encouraged, since the campers will be involved in a lot of hitting drills.

REFUNDS: If a pre-registered camper is unable to attend the camp, a refund less the deposit of \$50 will be refunded. **Refunds must be requested by July 15, 2009.**

NO CHECKES will be accepted on the day of registration. Cash or money orders ONLY.

DURING THE WEEK: Overnight campers will reside in an air conditioned, on campus dormitory room. Meals for overnight campers will be provided in the on campus dining facility. Rooms will be assigned on the day of registration, and we will honor roommate requests **when possible**. Five baseball fields are available for camp use, along with the All-Star Batting Cages in Goldsboro. Campers will have ample training facilities, equipment and quality instruction to further their baseball skills. SUPERVISION IS PROVIDED 24 HOURS A DAY BY RESPONSIBLE STAFF MEMBERS. Medical services are also available around the clock, along with trainers around for camp activities

Mount Olive College Baseball Camp

CAMP INFORMATION

Campers will reside in Grantham Hall Dormitory on the Mount Olive College campus. The Student Center on campus has games, TV and vending machines.

Athletic Trainers will be housed in Grantham Hall. Trainers will be available around the clock as needed. The training room is located in the Pope Wellness Center.

VALUABLES AND PERSONAL PROPERTY: Mount Olive College Baseball Camp and Mount Olive College are not responsible for items that are lost or stolen. A valuable bag will be provided for each team during camp sessions. Bags will be secured during the session. Room keys will be issued to each camper during registration. A \$10 refundable deposit upon return of key at departure.

ITEMS TO BRING: Towels, wash clothes, twin sheets, blanket, pillow with case, and personal items.

ITEMS ON SALE DURING THE WEEK: T-shirts, caps and batting gloves.

Campers will be required to stay on campus during their session. Any camper who drives to camp must turn their car keys into the Camp Director at registration. Vehicle make, model, license number is to be written down and turned in with the keys. Should the camper need to leave during the week for any reason, permission must be obtained from the Camp Director, Carl Lancaster. If any problem occurs in reference to rooming assignments, camp t-shirts and/or hat sizes, or any other situations that need attention, please direct the questions or comments to Camp Director, Carl Lancaster.

CLOTHING: Provided for campers by the camp: (1) T-shirt, bats, balls, helmets and catchers gear. Campers should bring shoes (metal spikes for high school players only); pants, gloves, additional shirts, gear for individual positions, long pants will be needed for some of the sessions.

NOTICE TO ALL CAMPERS, PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF CAMPERS: Mount Olive College policy prohibits the use, sale, distribution, possession of any drugs and/or narcotics. The evidence or suspicion in reference to any drug and/or narcotic will result in the parent(s) or guardian being contacted and the camper will be sent home. Intentional destruction of property or theft constitutes a criminal act. Possession of any weapon or dangerous device is not allowed. The possession and/or consumption of any intoxicating beverage or evidence of will be reason for dismissing suspected from the campus. The use of any tobacco product, to include, but not limited to, chewing tobacco, smoking, is not permitted inside any college facility during the camp activity week.

RESIDENT CAMPERS INFORMATION: Lights and music off at 11:00 pm nightly. It is very important that everyone be allowed to get a good nights rest. In the past, problems have resulted from the use of large boom boxes. Only smaller radios with alarm clocks will be allowed. Tapes, CDs, etc. are discouraged due to the fact that they often "walk off"! There will be no running, jumping or horseplay allowed in the dorms. Abusive language or abusive behavior will not be tolerated. Any damage of college property will be the financial responsibility of the violator. No cooking or heating of food allowed in the dorms. No hot plates, burners or microwave allowed.

Camp personnel and athletic trainers will be housed in the same dorm with campers. They will serve as Dorm Directors. Campers will be grouped by their age.
