CLEP (College Level Examination Program)

Test Dates: The College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) is now a computer based examination administered by appointment Monday through Thursday. The test takes about two hours, and is only offered on the computer.

Registration: To register, contact Dana Bayliss at 252-633-4464, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. A \$15 administration fee, payable by cash only, is due on the day of the test.

Cost: The \$70 test fee is paid to CLEP at the time the test is administered. This must be paid by check card or credit card only.

THE DAY OF THE TEST

Bring to the Center: Current official photo identification card (Driver's License).

The Test: The CLEP tests are 90 minutes in length and are of two types, General Examinations and Subject Examinations. The General Examinations measure college level achievement in five basic areas of the liberal arts: English Composition, Humanities, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, and Social Science/History; the Subject Examinations measure achievement in specific college courses.

Sending Scores to Colleges: You may designate the score recipient at the time of testing. The name and address of the score recipient must be included on your answer sheet on the day of the test to avoid additional charges. If additional score reports are needed, you must send the appropriate fee to CLEP as directed on your personal score report.

Receiving Your Score: CLEP will mail your score report directly to you at the address you indicate on your answer sheet on the day of the test. Your score report will be your permanent record, and it should be **retained**. The score report should reach you about two weeks after the test. Contact CLEP for additional information about your scores (609-771-7865).

Minimum Score Requirements: Each university and/or department establishes its own minimum score. Mount Olive College requires students to make at least a 50 on each exam.

Retaking the CLEP: Any examination may be repeated six months or more after you last took it. If six months has not elapsed between the tests, test scores will be cancelled and test fees forfeited.

Cost: The \$80 test fee is paid to DSST at the time the test is administered. This must be paid by credit card or check card only.
